Kamala Harris voiced support for the defund the police movement, and called to redirect resources from police.

- **Kamala Harris voiced support for the defund the police movement.** “Vice President Kamala Harris voiced support for ‘defund the police’ in a radio interview in June 2020 amidst nationwide protests for police reform, just months before denouncing the movement after she had joined the Biden presidential campaign. Harris said in the June radio interview the movement ‘rightly’ called out the amount of money spent on police departments instead of community services such as education, housing, and healthcare, emphasizing that more police did not equate to more public safety. ‘This whole movement
